Introduction

We have reviewed the accompanying condensed interim financial statements of **Dubai National Insurance & Reinsurance Co. (P.S.C.), Dubai - United Arab Emirates** (the "Entity") which comprise the condensed interim statement of financial position as at **June 30, 2020** and the condensed interim statement of profit or loss and other comprehensive income, condensed interim statement of changes in equity and condensed interim statement of cash flows for the six months period then ended. Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of this interim financial information in accordance with IAS 34 - Interim Financial Reporting ("IAS 34"). Our responsibility is to express a conclusion on this condensed interim financial information based on our review.

Scope of review

We conducted our review in accordance with the International Standard on Review Engagements 2410 *Review of Interim Financial Information Performed by the Independent Auditor of the Entity*. A review of interim financial information consists of making inquiries, primarily of persons responsible for financial and accounting matters, and applying analytical and other review procedures. A review is substantially less in scope than an audit conducted in accordance with International Standards on Auditing and consequently does not enable us to obtain assurance that we would become aware of all significant matters that might be identified in an audit. Accordingly, we do not express an audit opinion.

Conclusion

Based on our review, nothing has come to our attention that causes us to believe that the accompanying condensed interim financial information is not prepared, in all material respects, in accordance with IAS 34 "Interim Financial Reporting".

**Notes to the condensed interim financial statements for the six months period ended June 30, 2020
(unaudited)**

1 Legal status and business activities

- 1.1** **Dubai National Insurance & Reinsurance Co. (P.S.C.), Dubai** (the "Entity") was incorporated as a public shareholding company in Emirates of Dubai - United Arab Emirates established on January 06, 1992. The shares of the Entity are listed on the Dubai Financial Market.
- 1.2** The Entity is licensed to engage in insurance and reinsurance of all classes of business in accordance with the provisions of United Arab Emirates Federal Law No. 6 of 2007 on Establishment of the Insurance Authority and Organisation of Insurance Operations.
- 1.3** The registered office of the Entity is located at floor no.7 & 9, Dubai National Insurance Building, Port Saeed, P.O. Box 1806, Dubai - United Arab Emirates.

2 Basis of preparation

2.1 Basis of preparation

These condensed interim financial statements have been prepared in accordance with International Accounting Standard 34 "Interim Financial Reporting" and is presented in Arab Emirates Dirham (AED) which is the functional and presentation currency of the Entity and rounded off to nearest thousands.

These condensed interim financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis, except for revaluation of certain financial instruments.

The accounting policies and methods of computation adopted in preparing these condensed interim financial statements are consistent with those used in the audited financial statements for the year ended December 31, 2019.

All aspects of the financial risk management objectives and policies are consistent with those disclosed in the audited financial statements for the year ended December 31, 2019.

These condensed interim financial statements do not include all the information and disclosures required for full annual financial statements prepared in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standards and should be read in conjunction with the audited financial statements for the year ended December 31, 2019.

The interim result for the six months period ended June 30, 2020 is not necessarily indicative of the result that may be expected for the financial year ending December 31, 2020.

The preparation of these condensed interim financial statements require the management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of accounting policies and the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, incomes and expenses. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

In preparing these condensed interim financial statements, the significant judgements made by management in applying the accounting policies and the key sources of estimation uncertainty were the same as those that were applied to the audited financial statements for the year ended December 31, 2019.

3 Significant accounting policies

The accounting policies used in the preparation of condensed interim financial statements are consistent with those used in the preparation of the annual financial statements for the year ended December 31, 2019. Certain amendments to accounting standards and annual improvements, as disclosed in the Entity's most recent annual financial statements for the year ended December 31, 2019, are applicable to the Entity but do not have any material impact on these condensed interim financial information.

3 Significant accounting policies (continued)

Critical accounting estimates and judgements in applying accounting policies

The Entity makes estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities within the next financial year. Estimates and judgements are continually evaluated and based on historical experience and other factors, including expectations of future events that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances. Actual results may substantially be different.

Outstanding claims and technical provisions

The estimation of the ultimate liability (both technical and outstanding) arising from claims made under insurance contracts is the Entity's most critical accounting estimate. These estimates are continually reviewed and updated and adjustments resulting from this review are reflected in the condensed interim financial information. The process relies upon the basic assumption that past experience, adjusted for the effect of current developments and likely trends (including actuarial calculation), is an appropriate basis for predicting future events.

Fair value of unquoted securities

Fair value of unquoted securities has been determined by the Entity based on Earnings Multiples and Net Assets Value Technique using observable market data of comparable public entities, certain discount factors and unobservable financial data of these non-public investees. Actual results may substantially be different. Further information on using the estimates is mentioned in note 6 to the condensed interim financial information.

Allowance for doubtful debts

Allowances for doubtful debts are determined using a combination of factors to ensure that insurance receivables are not overstated due to uncollectibility. The allowance for doubtful debts for all customers is based on a variety of factors, including the overall quality and ageing of receivables, continuing credit evaluation of the customer's financial conditions and collateral requirements from customers in certain circumstances. In addition, specific allowances for individual accounts are recorded when the Entity becomes aware of the customer's inability to meet its financial obligations.

11 Commitments and contingencies

In the normal course of business, the Entity's bankers have issued guarantees in favour of third parties amounting to AED 0.175 million (December 31, 2019: AED 0.175 million).

The Entity is subject to litigation in the normal course of its business. Although the ultimate outcome of these claims cannot presently be determined, adequate provisions have been made for any liability that may result, based on management's best estimates.

12 Dividends

The Board proposed cash dividend of AED 40.425 million (AED 0.35 per share) representing 35% of the paid up capital as at December 31, 2019. This was approved at the Annual General Meeting held on March 08, 2020 and distributed on March 25, 2020.

During the comparative period, the Board proposed cash dividend of AED 86.625 million (AED 0.75 per share) representing 75% of the paid up capital as at December 31, 2018. This was approved at the Annual General Meeting held on 31 March 2019 and distributed on 17 April 2019.

13 Events effecting the operations

The outbreak of the Covid-19 pandemic has caused worldwide significant financial and economic impact on all industries and sectors of the economy. The Entity has proactively implemented a business continuity plan and remote working plans to minimize business interruptions by providing timely and nonstop service to all clients and business partners. Resultantly the Entity does not foresee a significant impact on the Gross Written Premiums in subsequent periods. The Entity does not anticipate any major impact in relation to the Covid-19 situation due to its lower retention levels and the reinsurance being placed with internationally reputed "A" rated reinsurers. The Entity continues to maintain a strong liquidity position and robust solvency margins that remain significantly higher than the mandated requirement. The Entity's investment portfolio comprises long positions taken on large and financially stable corporations that generate consistent yearly cash dividends.
