Report of the Board of Directors

Dear Shareholders,

We are delighted to present the financial results of Sukoon Takaful PJSC (“the Company” or “Sukoon Takaful”) for the six-month period ended 30 June 2025.

The Company has delivered a standout performance in the first half of the year - **surpassing the entire 2024 revenue within just six months. Takaful revenue reached AED 105.9 million**, nearly doubling from **AED 55.3 million** in the same period last year - an impressive **92% year-on-year growth**. This achievement underscores the growing trust in our brand, and the increasing demand for Shari’ah-compliant insurance solutions.

Net profit before tax attributable to shareholders rose to reach AED 11.04 million compared to AED 6.19 million in the same period last year **reflecting a growth of 78% year-on-year**.

These exceptional results reflect the tangible outcomes of our transformation strategy launched in 2023, which has helped in stabilizing our operations, reestablishing prudent underwriting discipline coupled with a balanced investment portfolio. Our firm financial standing lays the groundwork for a trajectory of accelerated and resilient growth in the years ahead.

The surge has been further fueled by our focus on digital engagement and a growing uptake in both General and Family Takaful offerings including innovative investment-linked plans— positioning us to serve an increasingly diverse clientele, offering an enhanced product suite via new distribution channels and greater focus on customer centricity.

Sukoon Takaful’s accelerating market momentum continues to build a compelling trajectory for the rest of the year. As we advance through the second half of 2025, we remain resolute in our pursuit of sustained profitable growth and firmly focused on establishing Sukoon Takaful as a premier Takaful provider across the region.

**Review report and interim condensed financial statements

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REPORT ON REVIEW OF INTERIM CONDENSED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS TO THE SHAREHOLDERS OF SUKOON TAKAFUL P.J.S.C

Introduction

We have reviewed the accompanying interim condensed financial statements of Sukoon Takaful P.J.S.C (the “Company”), which comprise the interim condensed statement of financial position as at 30 June 2025 and the related interim condensed statements of profit or loss, interim condensed statement of comprehensive income for the three-month and six-month period then ended, and the interim condensed statement of changes in equity and cash flows for the six-month period then ended and explanatory notes.

Management is responsible for the preparation and presentation of these interim condensed financial statements in accordance with International Accounting Standard IAS 34, *Interim Financial Reporting* (“IAS 34”). Our responsibility is to express a conclusion on these interim condensed financial statements based on our review.

Scope of review

We conducted our review in accordance with International Standard on Review Engagements 2410, *Review of Interim Financial Information Performed by the Independent Auditor of the Entity*. A review of interim financial information consists of making inquiries, primarily of persons responsible for financial and accounting matters, and applying analytical and other review procedures. A review is substantially less in scope than an audit conducted in accordance with International Standards on Auditing and consequently does not enable us to obtain assurance that we would become aware of all significant matters that might be identified in an audit. Accordingly, we do not express an audit opinion.

Conclusion

Based on our review, nothing has come to our attention that causes us to believe that the accompanying interim condensed financial statements are not prepared, in all material respects, in accordance with IAS 34, *Interim Financial Reporting*.

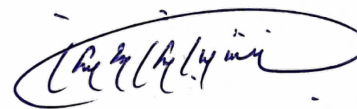

1 General information

Sukoon Takaful PJSC (the "Company") is a public shareholding company and was registered in 1992. The Company is engaged in takaful and retakaful of all classes of business in accordance with the provisions of the United Arab Emirates ("UAE") Federal Decree-Law No. 48 of 2023, concerning Financial Regulations of Insurance Companies issued by the Central Bank of United Arab Emirates and regulation of its operations. The address of the Company's registered office is P.O. Box 1993, Dubai, United Arab Emirates.

The Shareholders Extraordinary General Assembly Meeting held on 19 March 2014 approved conversion of the Company's business from conventional insurance to Takaful insurance. The Board of Directors appointed an Internal Sharia Supervision Committee for overseeing the compliance with Sharia. The Company started issuing short term takaful contracts from 1 February 2015 in connection with Family Takaful and non-Family Takaful such as motor, marine, fire, engineering, medical and general accident risks (collectively known as general takaful). The Company only operates in United Arab Emirates, through its Dubai and Abu Dhabi offices.

3 Basis of preparation and material accounting policy information

3.1 Basis of preparation

These interim condensed financial statements for the six-month period ended 30 June 2025 has been prepared in accordance with International Accounting Standard 34, "Interim Financial Reporting" ("IAS 34") issued by the International Accounting Standards Board ("IASB") and also complies with the applicable requirements of the laws in the U.A.E.

These interim condensed financial statements are presented in Arab Emirates Dirham ("AED") and all values are rounded to nearest thousand ("AED'000") except when otherwise indicated.

These interim condensed financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis, except for the revaluation of financial investments measured at fair value through profit or loss, financial investments measured at fair value through other comprehensive income and investment properties measured at fair value.

The Company presents its statement of financial position broadly in order of liquidity, with a distinction based on expectations regarding recovery or settlement within twelve months after the reporting date (current) and more than twelve months after the reporting date (non-current).

These interim condensed financial statements do not include all the information required for full annual financial statements and should be read in conjunction with the Company's audited annual financial statements as at and for the year ended 31 December 2024. In addition, results for the six-month period ended 30 June 2025 are not necessarily indicative of the results that may be expected for the financial year ending 31 December 2025.

3.2 Material accounting policy information

The accounting policies, including those pertaining to financial assets, property and equipment and investment properties, applied by the Company in the preparation of These interim condensed financial statements are consistent with those applied by the Company in the annual financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2024 except for the following:

3.2.1 Takaful Contracts related to Family Takaful

The nature of the Family Takaful contracts issued by the Company, their classification and measurement model are summarised in the table below:

Measurement:

The company measures a group on contracts on initial recognition as the sum of the expected fulfilment cash flows within the contract boundary and the Contractual Service Margin (CSM) representing the unearned profit in contracts relating to services that will be provided under the contracts.

Fulfilment cash flows comprise unbiased and probability-weighted estimates of future cash flows, discounted to present value to reflect the time value of money and financial risks, plus a risk adjustment for non-financial risk.

Fulfilment cash flows comprise unbiased and probability-weighted estimates of future cash flows, discounted to present value to reflect the time value of money and financial risks, plus a risk adjustment for non-financial risk. The Company's objective in estimating future cash flows is to determine the expected value, or the probability weighted mean, of the full range of possible outcomes, considering all reasonable and supportable information available at the reporting date without undue cost or effort. The Company estimates future cash flows considering a range of scenarios which have commercial substance and give a good representation of possible outcomes. The cash flows from each scenario are probability-weighted and discounted using current assumptions.

Measurement: (continued)

When estimating future cash flows, the Company includes all cash flows that are within the contract boundary including:

- Contribution and related cash flows
- Claims and benefits, including reported claims not yet paid and expected future claims
- Payments to participants resulting from embedded surrender value options
- Claims handling costs
- Policy administration and maintenance costs, including recurring acquisition costs that are expected to be paid to intermediaries
- Costs incurred for performing investment activities that enhance takaful coverage benefits for the participant
- Costs incurred for providing investment-related service and investment-return service to participants
- Other costs specifically chargeable to the participant under the terms of the contract

The Company updates its estimates at the end of each reporting period using all newly available information, as well as historic evidence and information about trends. The Company determines its current expectations of probabilities of future events occurring at the end of the reporting period. In developing new estimates, the Company considers the most recent experience and earlier experience, as well as other information.

The measurement of fulfilment cash flows includes takaful acquisition cash flows which are allocated as a portion of contribution to profit or loss (through takaful revenue) over the period of the contract in a systematic and rational way on the basis of the passage of time.

Subsequent measurement:

The CSM at the end of the reporting period represents the profit in the group of takaful contracts that has not yet been recognised in profit or loss, because it relates to future service to be provided.

For a group of takaful contracts the carrying amount of the CSM of the group at the end of the reporting period equals the carrying amount at the beginning of the reporting period adjusted, as follows:

- The effect of any new contracts added to the group
- For contracts measured under the GMM, profit accreted on the carrying amount of the CSM during the reporting period, measured at the discount rates at initial recognition
- The changes in fulfilment cash flows relating to future service, except to the extent that:
 - Such increases in the fulfilment cash flows exceed the carrying amount of the CSM, giving rise to a loss; or
 - Such decreases in the fulfilment cash flows are allocated to the loss component of the liability for remaining coverage
- The effect of any currency exchange differences on the CSM
- The amount recognised as takaful revenue because of the transfer of takaful contract services in the period, determined by the allocation of the CSM remaining at the end of the reporting period (before any allocation) over the current and remaining coverage period.

For direct participating contracts measured under the VFA, the Company adjusts the CSM for the change in the amount of the Company's share of the fair value of the underlying items and changes in fulfilment cash flows that relate to future services, except to the extent that:

- a decrease in the amount of the Company's share of the fair value of the underlying items, or an increase in the fulfilment cash flows that relate to future services, exceeds the carrying amount of the CSM, giving rise to a loss in profit or loss (included in takaful service expenses) and creating a loss component; or
- an increase in the amount of the Company's share of the fair value of the underlying items, or a decrease in the fulfilment cash flows that relate to future services, is allocated to the loss component, reversing losses previously recognised in profit or loss (included in takaful service expenses).

Subsequent measurement: (continued)

The Company identifies the investment component of a contract by determining the amount that it would be required to repay to the participant in all scenarios with commercial substance. These include circumstances in which a covered event occurs or the contract matures or is terminated without a covered event occurring. Investment components are excluded from takaful revenue and takaful service expenses.

The changes in fulfilment cash flows relating to future service that adjust the CSM comprise of:

- Experience adjustments that arise from the difference between the contribution receipts (and any related cash flows such as takaful acquisition cash flows and takaful contribution taxes) and the estimate, at the beginning of the period, of the amounts expected. Differences related to contributions received (or due) related to current or past services are recognised immediately in profit or loss while differences related to contributions received (or due) for future services are adjusted against the CSM;
- Changes in estimates of the present value of future cash flows in the liability for remaining coverage. For contracts measured under the GMM these changes exclude those relating to the time value of money and changes in financial risk (recognised in the statement of profit or loss and other comprehensive income rather than adjusting the CSM);
- Differences between any investment component expected to become payable in the period and the actual investment component that becomes payable in the period. Those differences are determined by comparing (i) the actual investment component that becomes payable in the period with (ii) the payment in the period that was expected at the start of the period plus any takaful finance income or expenses related to that expected payment before it becomes payable.
- Changes in the risk adjustment for non-financial risk that relate to future service

For direct participating contracts measured under the VFA changes in fulfilment cash flows that relate to future services and adjust the CSM are measured at current discount rates and include the changes in the effect of the time value of money and financial risks that do not arise from underlying items.

Where, during the coverage period, a group of takaful contracts becomes onerous, the Company recognises a loss in profit or loss for the net outflow, resulting in the carrying amount of the liability for the group being equal to the fulfilment cash flows. A loss component is established by the Company for the liability for remaining coverage for such onerous group depicting the losses recognised.

The Company measures the carrying amount of a group of takaful contracts at the end of each reporting period as the sum of: (i) the liability for remaining coverage comprising fulfilment cash flows related to future service allocated to the group at that date and the CSM of the group at that date; and (ii) the liability for incurred claims for the group comprising the fulfilment cash flows related to past service allocated to the group at that date.

4 Critical accounting judgements and key sources of estimation of uncertainty

The preparation of interim condensed financial statements requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of accounting policies and the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, income and expense. Actual results may differ from these estimates. In preparing these interim condensed financial statements, the significant judgements made by management in applying the Company's accounting policies and the key sources of estimation uncertainty were the same as those that applied to the financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2024.

5 Risk management

The Company's takaful and financial risk management objectives and policies are consistent with those disclosed in the audited financial statements as at and for the year ended 31 December 2024. There have been no changes in any risk management policies since the year end. The Company is in compliance with the applicable solvency and capital requirements issued by the Central Bank of the United Arab Emirates ("CBUAE").

The Company's objectives when managing capital are i) to comply with the takaful capital requirements required by the regulators of the insurance industry where the entity operate, ii) to protect its participants' interests, iii) to safeguard the Company's ability to continue as a going concern so that it can continue to provide returns for the shareholders and benefits for other stakeholders; and iv) to provide an adequate return to the shareholders by pricing takaful contracts commensurately with the level of risk.

Section 2 of the Financial Regulations for Insurance Companies (the "Regulations") issued by the CBUAE identifies the required solvency margin to be held in addition to takaful liabilities. The solvency margin must be maintained at all times throughout the year. The Company is subject to the Regulations which has been complied with during the period/year. The Company has incorporated in its policies and procedures the necessary tests to ensure continuous and full compliance with these Regulations.

The table below summarises the Minimum Capital Requirement, Minimum Guarantee Fund and Solvency Capital Requirement of the Company and the total capital held to meet these solvency margins as defined in the Regulations. In accordance with Circular No. CBUAE/BSN/2022/923 of CBUAE dated 28 February 2022, the Company has disclosed the solvency position for the immediately preceding period as the current period solvency position is not yet finalised.

19 Wakala fees and Mudarib's share

Wakala fees

Wakala fee for the period ended 30 June 2025 amounted to AED 46,764 thousand (30 June 2024: AED 23,673 thousand). The fee is calculated based on each line of business of gross contribution of AED 174,858 thousand (2024: AED 78,910 thousand) without any deduction of policy acquisition cost. Wakala fee is charged to the statement of profit or loss when incurred.

Mudarib share

The shareholders also manage the participants' investment funds and charge Mudarib share. Mudarib share is charged at 30% of realised investment income. Mudarib share for the period ended 30 June 2025 amounted to AED 765 thousand (30 June 2024: AED 856 thousand).

20 Internal Sharia supervision committee

The Company's business activities are subject to the supervision of its Internal Sharia Supervision Committee consisting of three members appointed by the Shareholders. The Internal Sharia Supervision Committee perform a supervisory role in order to determine whether the operations of the Company are conducted in accordance with Sharia rules and principles.

According to the Company's Internal Sharia Supervision Committee, the Company is required to identify any income deemed to be derived from transactions not acceptable under Islamic Sharia principles, as interpreted by Internal Sharia Supervision Committee, and to set aside such amount in a separate account for Shareholders who may resolve to pay the same for local charitable causes and activities.

21 Subsequent events

22 Corporate Income tax

The Company is owned by a Group which is in scope of Pillar Two legislation as it operates in jurisdictions that have enacted or substantively enacted Pillar Two legislation and the Group's consolidated revenue exceeds Euro 750 million threshold.

The tax expense for the period ended 30 June 2025 is AED 1,500 thousand (30 June 2024: AED 487 thousand), reflecting a significant year-on-year increase which is primarily driven by the introduction and adoption of Top-up Tax on Multinational Enterprises with effect from 01 January 2025. The Effective Tax Rate ("ETR") of 13.59% (30 June 2024: 7.87%).
