Introduction

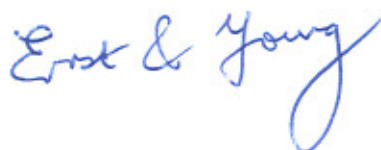
We have reviewed the accompanying interim consolidated balance sheet of Amlak Finance PJSC (the 'Company') as of 30 June 2007, the related interim consolidated statements of income for the three-month and six-month periods then ended, the related cash flows and the statement of changes in equity for the six-month period then ended and explanatory notes. Management is responsible for the preparation and presentation of these interim condensed consolidated financial statements in accordance with International Accounting Standard 34 Interim Financial Reporting ("IAS 34"). Our responsibility is to express a conclusion on these interim condensed consolidated financial statements based on our review.

Scope of Review

We conducted our review in accordance with International Standard on Review Engagements 2410 "Review of Interim Financial Information Performed by the Independent Auditor of the Entity". A review of interim financial information consists of making inquiries, primarily of persons responsible for financial and accounting matters, and applying analytical and other review procedures. A review is substantially less in scope than an audit conducted in accordance with International Standards on Auditing and consequently does not enable us to obtain assurance that we would become aware of all significant matters that might be identified in an audit. Accordingly, we do not express an audit opinion.

Conclusion

Based on our review, nothing has come to our attention that causes us to believe that the accompanying interim condensed consolidated financial statements are not presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with IAS 34.

1 ACTIVITIES

Amlak Finance PJSC (the 'Company') was incorporated in Dubai on 11 November 2000 as a private shareholding company in accordance with UAE Federal Law No (8) of 1984, as amended.

At the constituent shareholders' meeting held on 9 March 2004, a resolution was passed to convert the Company to a public joint stock company. Further, a resolution was passed to transform the Company's activities to be in full compliance with the Islamic Sharia'a rules and principles.

The Company is licensed by the UAE Central Bank as a finance company and is primarily engaged in financing and investing activities such as Ijara, Murabaha, Mudaraba, Musharaka. The activities of the Company are conducted in accordance with Islamic Sharia'a, which prohibits usury, and within the provisions of its Articles and Memorandum of Association. The Company's shares are listed on Dubai Financial Market.

The registered address of the Company is P.O. Box 2441, Dubai, United Arab Emirates.

2 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The interim condensed financial statements of the Company are prepared in accordance with International Accounting Standard 34, Interim Financial Reporting. The accounting policies used in the preparation of the interim condensed financial statements are consistent with those used in the preparation of the annual financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2006 except for the adoption of new standards and interpretations, noted below;

IFRS 7 Financial Instruments Disclosures

The Company has adopted IFRS 7, which requires disclosures that enable users to evaluate the significance of the Company's financial instruments and the nature and extent of risks arising from those financial instruments. These new disclosures will be included in the Company's annual financial statements for the year ending 31 December 2007.

IAS 1 Amendment - Presentation of Financial Statements

This amendment requires the Company to make new disclosures to enable users of the financial statements to evaluate the Company's objectives, policies and processes for managing capital. These new disclosures will be included in the Company's annual financial statements for the year ending 31 December 2007.

IFRIC 10 Interim Financial Reporting and Impairment

The Company has adopted IFRIC Interpretation 10 as of 1 January 2007, which requires that an entity must not reverse an impairment loss recognised in a previous interim period in respect of an investment in either an equity instrument or a financial asset carried at cost.

Adoption of these Standards and Interpretations did not have any effect on the financial position or performance of the Company.

The interim condensed financial statements do not contain all information and disclosures required for full financial statements prepared in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standards, and should be read in conjunction with the Company's annual financial statements as at 31 December 2006. In addition, results for the 6 months ended 30 June 2007 are not necessarily indicative of the results that may be expected for the financial year ending 31 December 2007.

3 BASIC EARNINGS PER SHARE

Basic earnings per share are calculated by dividing the profit attributable to the shareholders for the period of AED 81,848,000 (2006: AED 43,713,000) and AED 105,671,000 (2006: AED 80,847,000) for the three month and six month periods ended 30 June 2007, respectively, by the weighted average number of shares outstanding during the period of 1,500,000 of AED 1 each (2006: 1,500,000 of AED 1 each).

The Company has not issued any instruments which would have an impact on earnings per share when exercised.

4.1 Credit-related commitments include commitments to extend facilities designed to meet the requirements of the Company's customers. Commitments generally have fixed expiration dates, or other termination clauses, and normally require the payment of a fee. Since commitments may expire without being drawn upon, the total contract amounts do not necessarily represent future cash requirements.

4.2 The Company has commitments on account of uncalled capital of an associate and other investees. The Company has to pay as and when calls are made by the investee companies.

Contingencies

The Company has issued guarantees on behalf of an associate amounting to AED 412,285 thousand (2006: AED 414,135 thousand)

5 SEGMENT INFORMATION**Primary segment information**

For operational and management reporting purposes, the Company is organised in one major business segment of Islamic financing and investing activities.

Secondary segment information

For operational and management reporting purposes, the Company is organised in one geographical segment, Middle East. Consequently, no secondary segment information is required to be provided.

6 SEASONALITY OF RESULTS

Revenue includes dividend income of AED 566 thousand and AED 1,996 thousand for three month and six month periods ended 30 June 2007, respectively, and AED 3,677 thousand and AED 4,977 thousand for three month and six month periods ended 30 June 2006, respectively, which is of a seasonal nature.
