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Report on Review of Interim Condensed Financial Information

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The Board of Directors

Dubai Islamic Insurance & Reinsurance Co. (Aman) (PSC)

Dubai -United Arab Emirates

We have reviewed the accompanying interim condensed statement of financial position of **Dubai Islamic Insurance & Reinsurance Co. (Aman) (PSC)** (the "Company") as of June 30, 2009 and the related interim condensed statements of income, comprehensive income, changes in equity and cash flows for the period from January 1, 2009 to June 30, 2009, and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory notes. Management is responsible for the preparation and presentation of this interim condensed financial information in accordance with International Accounting Standard 34, 'Interim Financial Reporting ("IAS 34")' and the applicable provisions of the Articles of Association of the Company. Our responsibility is to express a conclusion on this interim condensed financial information based on our review. The interim condensed financial information for the period from January 1, 2008 to June 30, 2008, were reviewed by another auditor who issued a review report on that interim condensed financial information on July 21, 2008. The condensed balance sheet as of December 31, 2008 and related notes were audited by the same auditor who issued a qualified opinion dated March 23, 2009.

Scope of review

We conducted our review in accordance with the International Standard on Review Engagements 2400. This Standard requires that we plan and perform the review to obtain moderate assurance as to whether the interim condensed financial information are free of material misstatement. A review is limited primarily to inquiries of company personnel and analytical procedures applied to financial data and thus provide less assurance than an audit. We have not performed an audit and, accordingly, we do not express an audit opinion.

Basis for Qualified Conclusion

The cumulative decline in fair value of available-for-sale securities amounted to AED 103,500,438, of which AED 72,167,172 was charged to equity and AED 31,333,267 was charged to policyholders' funds. Given the current significant difficulties in the financial markets and their resultant impact on prices of equity instruments, management considers that the current quoted prices of the financial assets do not necessarily reflect the extent of impairment in fair values in all cases. Accordingly, no impairment loss has been recorded in the condensed statement of income on these investments as might have been required under IAS 39: Financial Instruments: Recognition and Measurement. As we are unable to assess the reasonableness of this assumption because of its subjective nature, we have not been able to conclude on whether any part of the decline in fair value should be considered as impairment and the resulting effect on the loss for the period.

Qualified Conclusion

Based on our review, except for the effects of the matters discussed in the previous paragraph, nothing has come to our attention that causes us to believe that the accompanying interim condensed financial information is not prepared, in all material respects, in accordance with International Accounting Standard 34.

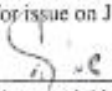

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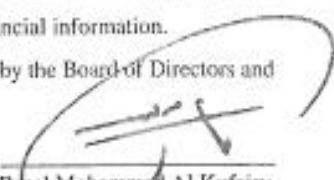

Notes to the Interim Condensed Financial Information
For the Period from January 1, 2009 to June 30, 2009

1. General information

Dubai Islamic Insurance & Reinsurance Company (Aman) (PSC) is a public shareholding company and is registered under the Commercial Companies Law of 1984 (as amended). The Company carries out general insurance business in accordance with the teachings of Islamic Sharia'a. The Company is also licensed to engage in reinsurance and life assurance business. The registered address of the Company is P.O. Box 157, Dubai, United Arab Emirates.

The Company obtained its commercial license on March 12, 2003 and commenced operations on April 8, 2003.

The Company mainly issues short term insurance contracts in connection with motor, marine, fire and engineering, general accident risks and group life and medical risks (collectively known as general insurance). The Company also invests its funds in investment securities and properties.

The Company's business activities are subject to the supervision of a Sharia'a Board consisting of three members appointed by the shareholders. The Sharia'a Board performs a supervisory role in order to determine whether the operations of the Company are conducted in accordance with Sharia'a rules and principles.

2. Accounting policies

The interim condensed consolidated financial information have been prepared on the historical cost basis, except for certain financial instruments, which are carried at fair value.

The interim condensed financial information of the Company are prepared in accordance with International Accounting Standard 34, Interim Financial Reporting. The accounting policies used in the preparation of the interim condensed financial statements are consistent with those used in the preparation of the annual financial statements for the year ended December 31, 2008, except for the impact of the adoption of the Standard described below:

IAS 1 (Revised) *Presentation of Financial Statements* (effective for accounting periods beginning on or after January 1, 2009).

The revised Standard has introduced a number of terminology changes (including revised titles for the condensed financial statements) and has resulted in a number of changes in presentation and disclosure. However, the revised Standard has had no impact on the reported results or financial position of the Company.

2. Accounting policies (continued)

The interim condensed financial information do not contain all information and disclosures required for full financial statements prepared in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standards and should be read in conjunction with the Company's financial statements as of December 31, 2008. In addition, results for the six months ended June 30, 2009 are not necessarily indicative of the results that may be expected for the financial year ending December 31, 2009.

(a) Estimates

The preparation of interim condensed financial information requires management to make judgments, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of accounting policies and the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, income and expense. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

In preparing these interim condensed financial information, the significant judgments made by management in applying the Company's accounting policies and the key sources of estimation uncertainty were the same as those that were applied to the financial statements as at and for the year ended December 31, 2008.

(b) Financial risk management

The Company's financial risk management objectives and policies are consistent with those disclosed in the financial statements as at and for the year ended December 31, 2008.

The articles of association of the Company require that separate accounts be maintained for insurance operations on behalf of the policyholders. Accordingly, the directors have resolved to present the financial statements on that basis and comply with the Financial Accounting Standards issued by the Accounting and Auditing Organization for Islamic Financial Institutions (AAOIFI) to the extent that these are compatible with International Financial Reporting Standards.

6. Investment income (continued)

Investment income and losses are allocated to the shareholders in the ratio of equity at beginning of the year to total assets at the end of the year excluding the current year profit, furniture and equipment and end of service benefits. The remaining gain or loss is allocated to the policyholders. This allocation to policyholders is approved by the Company's Sharia'a Supervisory Board on an annual basis.

7. Segmental information

The Company has adopted IFRS 8 Operating Segments with effect from January 1, 2009. The segments identified in accordance with IFRS 8 do not differ materially from those previously disclosed under IAS 14.

Operating Segments are identified on the basis of internal reports about the components of the company that are regularly reviewed by the Company's Chief Executive Officer (CEO)/Managing Director (MD) in order to allocate resources to the segment and to assess its performance. Information reported to the Company's CEO for the purpose of resource allocation and assessment of performance is based on following strategic business activities:

- **Insurance activities** include the general, life and medical insurance business undertaken by the Company.
- **Investment activities** represent investment and cash management for the Company's own account.

9. Statutory reserve

In accordance with the Commercial Companies Law and the Company's Articles of Association, 10% of the net profit for the year is required to be transferred to statutory reserve. No transfers have been made during the period from January 1, 2009 to June 30, 2009, as this will be based on the results for the year. The reserve is not available for distribution except in the circumstances stipulated by the law.

10. General reserve

The Company is required to transfer 10% of the profit for the year to a general reserve in accordance with its Articles of Association. No transfer has been made to the general reserve during the period from January 1, 2009 to June 30, 2009, as this will be based on the results for the year.

11. Related party transactions

The Managing Director of the Company is also a key management executive of Leader Capital, Al Salam Bank - Sudan, Al Salam Bank - Bahrain and Al Salam Bank - Algeria. The pricing policies and terms of these transactions are approved by the management.

As of June 30, 2009, the Company has ownership of 3,276,520 shares of Al Salam Bank - Bahrain. These shares are registered in the name of Leader Capital which is holding it in trust for and on behalf of the Company. The market value of the shares as at the end of the period was AED 3.66 million.

At the current period, a major shareholder (Dubai Islamic Bank PJSC) sold its equity interest in the Company of 6% through Dubai Financial Market.

12. Contingencies and commitments

Contingent liabilities

At June 30, 2009, the Company had contingent liabilities in respect of bank and other guarantees arising in the ordinary course of business from which it is anticipated that no material liabilities will arise, amounting to AED 1,271,513 (December 31, 2008: AED 1,021,513).

Legal claims

The Company, in common with the majority of insurers, is subject to litigation in the normal course of its business. Based on independent legal advice, the management does not believe that the outcome of these court cases will have a material impact on the Company's income or financial position.

Commitments

The Company has a commitment for AED 14.7 million (2008: AED 14.7 million) on account of investments made in securities and properties. The Company has to pay for investment securities as and when calls are made by the investee company. Commitment in respect of purchase of investment properties is payable on various dates by February 2010.
